- 1. The introductory paragraph is very confusing. Several laws cited but sytanx makes it difficult to follow principal point
- 2. Twenty years of fiscal decentralization is very little. Often times, the desired objectives of a decentralization process don't come until several decades after implementation
- 3. In figure 1 the grading scale on the left-hand axis is unclear, I think the authors mean 'bad' and 'very bad' instead of 'less' and 'very less'
- 4. I still don't quite understand the point of figures 1 and 2. What are they showing? For example, in figure 1, the authors state that the numbers on the charts indicate the decentralized ratio, with higher values denoting greater financial capability. Why then are the biggest numbers by the 'very less' gradient? Shouldn't these numbers be a good thing? Also, what exactly are those charts showing? The share of counties deemed very good, good, etc? Same questions with figure 2. What exactly are those charts showing? The share of something in 5 different points in time?
- 5. The literature review is lacking. At the very least, the authors should include the following works that touch on many of the principal points of their argument:

- 6. The authors should try to explain/justify why certain variables do not exert the expected impact on the outcome variable. For instance, based on the results for Model 1, table 1, fiscal decentralization actually dampens GDP growth. Why is that? Is it because the fiscal decentralization process in Indonesia is faulty? Incomplete? Too young? Institutionally weak? In other words, the authors have to rationalize their empirical findings
- 7. An interaction term between different indicators of decentralization and the HDI would also add to the empirical analysis. In other words, the authors try to argue that both decentralization and human development affect economic growth, yet they do not use an interactive term between those variables to test the hypothesis.
- 8. English syntax has to improve throughout the document









